Challenge

Pacific had to construct from the foundations up and fit out to an extremely high standard an all-new, two-storey restaurant for McDonald's on a high-profile site overlooking the River Clyde in Port Glasgow. This huge 170-seat diner sits on a prime location at the entrance to the Clydebuilt Shopping Park, within which are located a large number of big-name retail companies.

Approach

Pacific were acutely aware not just of the scale of the project but of its need to set the tone for customers visiting the shopping park, as it occupies the plum spot at its entrance. Liaison with partner agencies, architects, design teams, sub-contractors and suppliers was key as Pacific drew on their vast experience of delivering to deadline and to budget for high-profile client companies. The project was commenced towards the start of August 2018 and was handed over on schedule to the clients in November, 2018.

Results

The restaurant boasts a side-by-side drive-thru and two drive-thru waiting areas, two electric vehicle charging points, an outdoor eating area, play zone and a pedestrian link between it and the nearby Tesco supermarket. The design and layout sees light and space complementing natural and neutral colours and materials to ensure the diner provides customers with a relaxing atmosphere and eating experience as well as offering passers-by a pleasing yet striking visual presence.
